



2022 Canada Summer Games Team Alberta Daily Highlights Day 5

August 10th, 2022

Team Alberta wraps up Day 5 with History, Legacy and Multisport Colours.

Fifth Day of competition wraps up with an additional medal to our count!

NIAGARA FALLS, ON – Team Alberta started the day on the very muddy mountain biking track in Twelve Mile Creek. The women's team relay peddled hard to a third-place finish just 10 seconds ahead of western rivals British Columbia. Canada Games legacy was also present in the spectator area today as 1967 Canada Games and Team Alberta Alumni Kathy Francis witnessed her granddaughter Jenaya (Edmonton) capture the bronze in the women's team relay.

Men's and Women's wrestling both kicked off their team dual finals today. The men's team duels battled eastern province Quebec to an impressive finishing score of 37-15, leading them to a bronze medal victory. The women's team started with a disappointing loss against Team Ontario but managed to stay in the medal standings by battling out Team Saskatchewan and joined the men on the podium for another bronze medal win for Team Alberta.

Canada Summer Games first historical rugby sevens competition comes to a close for Team Alberta as they fall short versus Team Quebec today with a defeating score of 26-15. They finish these Games with a fifth place standing right behind fourth place east coasters Nova Scotia.

Box Lacrosse continues their winning pursuits on the field as they finish with a running score of 16-2 over Team New Brunswick. This winning game will lead Team Alberta in the semi finals tomorrow versus west coast rivals British Columbia.

Team Alberta finishes the day at the pool with a colourful finish. Maxine Clark (Calgary) continues her podium pursuits by flying ahead of British Columbia in the women's 100m Butterfly and adds gold to her collection. Nicholas Duncan (Calgary) also followed this podium pursuit by finishing in front of Team British Columbia and stepping up to first place in the men's 100m Butterfly. Team Alberta Women's 4x100m medley relay raced hard and added the last golden touch to today's medal count, while the men's relay team came really close to adding another piece to the golden hour but they had to settle for silver behind Team British Columbia.
